I Jose Ferreira de ALENCAR: Anthropologist; arrested with his two daughters as he sought asylum in the Mexican Embassy. Is now at liberty but awaiting trial and group is therefore still continuing inquiries. Mis. 2

A Gerson da Conceicao de Almeida: Catholic priest who disappeared on 3rd October 1971 with a sociologist Lucio de Brito Castelo Branco (also an Amnesty case in the past - the latter has now been released, with the mental age of an 8 yr old, a consequence of alleged torture). Gerson was arrested apparently for his involvement with FASE (Federacao dos Orgaos para Assistencia Social e Educacional) which was the subject of a police inquiry. He was apparently denied the right to see a doctor and was mal-treated in detention. He was acquitted of one trial and awaits the outcome of a further trial in liberty. C 2

- A Custodio Feitosa de AMORIM: Employee of Comisao Tecnica, a group attached to dom Helder Camara, archbishop of Olinda and Recife. He was arrested in October of this year but the arrest has not yet officially been acknowledged. The motive is thought to be his connections with the archbishop. C 7

- I Vanderlan Antonio de ARAUJO: ex-president of the EEC (students centre for culture) of Federal University of Goias. He is accused of having made speeches in March 1969 against the national security. He disappeared three years ago in summer 1970. S 5

- A Vulpiano Cavalcanti de Araujo: doctor; tried before a court in Recife accused of attempting to reorganise the Brazilian Communist Party and of publishing its official paper 'Voz Operario'. M 7

- A Paulo Otavio AZEVEDO Junior: arrested in early 1970 accused of having tried to re-establish cells of the extinct Communist Party in three towns of Sao Paulo state. 3

- I Alailton de Lima BARBOSA: student at university of Rio de Janeiro; accused of belonging to a student movement which organised strikes and promoted university reform. Has been detained since early 1970. S 2

- I Jaime Larry BENCHIMOL: student accused of participating in student demonstrations during Rockefellers visit to Brazil in 1969. Said to have confessed, during interrogation, to being a member of MR-8 (the guerilla group). Rumours have reached us that he is at liberty, the group is investigating. S 2

- I Arno BRICHTA: arrested in June 1973 in Salvador, Bahia. Professor of geography at the Institute of Geological Sciences of Universidade Federal da Bahia. Believed held incommunicado for a long period, with one of the students of the Institute, in the Salvador military barracks. A 9

- I Wanderley CAIXE: 10 year sentence for 'subversive activities' in Ribeirao Preto and for alleged involvement in formation of FLN (Frente de Libertacao Nacional). Case was dropped previously because of inability to progress on investigation but recent developments which may allow the group to contact the prisoner directly - and ascertain whether he is a prisoner of conscience or not - has led to the file being opened again. 3

- + I Djalma Quirino de CARVALHO: Sentenced to five years in 1971 for subversive activities in Ribeirao Preto. Very little information and the group are investigating. 3

- I Edvaldo Dias de CARVALHO: student at Instituto Central de Artes in the university of Brasilia; released pending trial and the group are still investigating. S 6
Lawyer: unknown Sweden 26
- A Horacio Martins de CARVALHO: professor at university of Campinas in state of Sao Paulo; arrested shortly after the arrest of Luis Basilio Rossi on the 15th February 1973. The motive for his detention was thought to have been his acquaintanceship with Rossi (another Amnesty case). Since taking up the case, however, we have received information to the effect that he is suspected of alleged militancy with the Brazilian Communist Party. T 3

- I Carlucio de Souza CASTANHA F^O: metal worker; 22yrs old; arrested by police on leaving his home in Recife, in October this year. His whereabouts are not yet known. It is thought that Carlucio might be linked with dom Helder Camara's social work in the area around Recife. TU 7

A Paulo de Tarso CELESTINO Filho: convicted in a group of 28 people accused of re-establishing the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Sentenced to 2½ years. Graduate teacher. Many conflicting rumours as to his possible death and groups are investigating facts. T 6

I Jaime Nelio DICK: accused of subversive activities. The judge who tried the original case was accused by the defence lawyers of 'errors, abuses and violations'. His confession was allegedly obtained under torture. 6

+ I Graciela Meinberg FADUL: doctor; 51 years old; wife of the Minister of Health under Goulart; arrested 26th March 1973 at a party. Held in Central Army hospital where she was taken after reportedly being tortured - present whereabouts unknown. M 2

A Luis Carlos Henrique FERNANDES: accused of trying to re-establish cells of the extinct Communist Party in 3 towns of Sao Paulo state. 3

A Jorge Galvao Fidelino de FIGUEIREDO: graduate in economics of Catholic University of Sao Paulo and formerly economics editor of Brazilian magazine 'Visao'. Reportedly tortured. Case raised at Commission on Press Freedom of the Inter American Press Association. After several months of detention - when authorities would not even admit that he was being held - he was brought to trial and sentenced to 4 years for 'spreading subversive propaganda'. J Mis. 3

I Oto Jose Matos FILGUEIRAS: student of commerce arrested in September 1973 in Sao Paulo in wave of arrests involving many students. S 3

I Luis Carlos GUIMARAES: arrested 27th April 1973 in offices of Correio da Manha, the Brazilian newspaper. He is a journalist. Reports of his release have been received but this still has to be confirmed. J 2

I Orlando JACINTO: sentenced in the municipality of Mage for subversive activities undertaken before 1964. Sentenced in 1970. 2

- I Francisco JATOBA: arrested in June 1973 in Salvador, Bahia. Student at the Institute of Geological Sciences of the Federal University of Bahia. Held along with a professor from the Institute, Arno Brichta, and both are believed to be in detention in the Quartel General of Salvador. S 9

- + I Teresa Maria de Paula JOCA: student at the faculty of Philosophy and Social Sciences at Fortaleza university. Arrested in May 1970 and accused of membership in the Trotskyist-Bolshevik faction of the Workers Revolutionary Party. Reports of her release some time ago are being investigated. S A 1 Mis

- A Israelis KAIROVSKY: engineer arrested in Sao Paulo in March 1971. Believed to have been arrested after receiving a letter from a friend who had recently left Brazil, in which this departure was explained. Reported to have been badly tortured. His release has been rumoured and group is investigating. Mis. 3

- + I Sandra LAZZARINI: student arrested in March 1973 and not charged or tried until August 1973. Held incommunicado longer than legally permissible. S

- A Jose LEITE F^O: journalist; ex deputy; arrested in February 1973; was still being held incommunicado in March 1973. Suffers from serious heart trouble. J 1

- I Luis Carlos LEITE: 24 yrs. old; former student who gave up studies to help family financially. Arrested along with his father, Jose Leite Filho, in February 1973. We have heard that he may have been released and are investigating. S 1

- I Vitor Antonio LETIZIA: student at university of Rio Grande do Sul. Arrested May 1970 for membership in a 'subversive organisation'; police confiscated pamphlets and a clandestine printing press. Was being held in the barracks of the 19th Infantry Regiment in Sao Leopoldo near Porto Alegre. No news as to final sentence or acquittal. Studied in England at one time. 3 4
 Lawyer: Eloor Guazzelli Germany 120
- I Manuel Ferreira de LIMA: sentenced to four years in the municipality of Mago for subversive activities before 1964. Sentenced in 1970 2
 Lawyer: Unknown Sweden 158
- A Nicanor Augusto de LIMA: civil servant; married; age unknown. Arrested in May 1966 in Nilopolis, Rio de Janeiro. Held at Vila Militar in the state of Gouabara. May now have been released but group trying to get confirmation. C/S 2
 Lawyer: Unknown Sweden 113
- A Vicente Lopes de LIMA: brought to trial in Recife accused of attempting to reorganise the Brazilian Communist Party and of publishing its official paper "Voz Operaria". 2 7
 Lawyer: Unknown USA 21
 Germany 309
- A José Ribamar LOPES: lawyer; convicted in a group of 26 people in Brasilia on charges of attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Conflicting statements of 2½ and 3½ year sentences reported. L 6
 Lawyer: Unknown Germany 17
- A Paulo Wagner de Silva MACEDO: student; accused of having participated in the IV Conference of the Brazilian Communist Party held in 1967. Tried with 26 others accused of trying to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Brasilia. Sentenced to three years. 3 6

- * A Maria Helena Neuman MACEDO: student at the university of Rio Grande do Sul. Arrested in May 1970 with other students accused of subversive activities. Police confiscated pamphlets and a clandestine printing press. Is reportedly free proceeds against her. Final sentence or acquittal not known. 3 4

- A Stanislaw Aikman MACIELSKI: lawyer accused of subversive activities and of falsification of PCB documents. Proceedings against him began in Rio in February 1971. L 2

- I Lucio Borges MARCELO: student at university of Rio Grande do Sul. Arrested with other students in May 1970, accused of membership of a subversive organisation. Police seized pamphlets and a clandestine printing press. S 4

- A Ataulpa Arruda MARIANO: brought to trial in Recife accused of attempting to reorganise the Brazilian Communist Party and of publishing its official paper 'Voz Operario'. J 7

- A Randal Azevedo MARQUES: DOPS in Sao Paulo asked for his preventative imprisonment in 1970 on charges of trying, along with 19 others to establish cells of the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns in the state of Sao Paulo. 3

- I Jose Roberto MICHELAZZO: student, sentenced to 2½ years imprisonment for having actively participated in a student demonstration in Sao Paulo at the end of 1968. Involved in other trials as well. S 3

- I Sergio Teles MOREIRA: arrested in August 1970 when a fire broke out in the central police station in Rio. Prisoners were transferred and Moreira, a student, held an impromptu meeting when they arrived at the police station in the Praca da Republica. Taken to Secretaria da Seguranca where he is reported to have been held incommunicado. No more details. S 2

- A Bento Ventura de MOURA: brought to trial in Recife accused of attempting to reorganise the Brazilian Communist Party and of publishing its official paper 'Voz Operario'. J 7

- A Mauro Correa NEVES: DOPS asked for his preventative imprisonment, along with 19 other persons, for attempting to re-establish cells of the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns in Sao Paulo. Is apparently now free but this has not been confirmed. 3

- I Licurgo NAKASU: arrested September 1973 in Sao Paulo in a wave of arrests involving many students particularly. 3
 Lawyer: Unknown Germany 484
- I Jose Flavio de OLIVEIRA: teacher; arrested September 1973 in Sao Paulo in the wave of arrests involving mainly students. T 3
 Lawyer: Unknown Denmark 29
- A Luis Medeiros de OLIVEIRA: student of engineering; arrested in northern Brazil while carrying out study of peasant and factory workers. Was allegedly badly tortured and attempted suicide. He is paralysed and was held in Recife hospital under police observation. He was released in January of this year but the groups are still following the case to follow up possibilities of aid. S 7

- I Jose Flavio Ramalho ORTIGAO: student; accused of subversion. Held incommunicado even longer than legally permissible; real reason for detention not known. S

- I Andre Tsumoto OTA: physics student at the state university of Sao Paulo; allegedly badly tortured. Permission was given by the appeal court for him to see his lawyer but the authorities at OBAN, where he was held, refused this. Since taking up the case we have learnt that he is accused of membership of ALN and has been given a 14 year prison sentence and has had his political rights suspended for 10 years. S 3

- A Euclides PECANHA F^O: Accused with 15 others of reorganising the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Sao Joao de Meriti. Believed to have been acquitted, but uncertain whether he has been released. 2

- + A Maria Regina PEIXOTO: student at university of Brasilia; released pending trial; was allegedly tortured and hospitalised for a while. No recent news; groups still investigating. S 6

- + A Angelina PERALVA: 21yrs old; student in social sciences at state university of Rio. Allegedly tortured. Is now in Germany after getting from Brazil to Chile and then forced to leave Chile at the time of the coup. Groups still following case just in event of financial assistance being necessary. S Mis 2
 Lawyer: Orozimbo de Almeida Rego and Paulo Eduardo Saboia Germany -367 Sweden 77
- I Antonio Carlos Melo PEREIRA: geology student at the university of Sao Paulo; arrested 1970 and held at OBAN headquarters contrary to orders from the Supreme Military Tribunal to have him transferred to prison. Accused of subversive activities. Allegedly driven mad under torture. S Mis 3
 Lawyer: Unknown Germany 366
- A Benedito Jose PEREIRA: arrested July 1973 but arrest still not officially acknowledged as of November. Employee of Operacao Esperanca - a social action group of the archdiocese of Olinda-Recife; probable motive for arrest was links with archbishop Camara. C 7

- I Jorge Goncalves PEREIRA: engineer, involved in trial of 65 persons cited under various articles of the Law of National Security. Said to have escaped but other prisoners saw him at the army police headquarters. In December 1971 the trial was postponed in order that he might be located. Mis. 2

- + I Elzira Vilela PINTO: doctor; arrested September 1973 in Sao Paulo in wave of arrests including many students. M 3
 Lawyer: Unknown Sweden 220
- A Joao Adolfo Castro Costa PINTO: journalist; involved in two suits, on related to attempts to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns in Sao Paulo state. J 3
 Reportedly went made under torture and was sent to Manicomio Judiciario Franco da Rocha in the state of Sao Paulo. Acquitted on one suit, one pending.
 Lawyer: Unknown Bilston College of Education
- A Ademar Alvarenga PRAVO: accused of making speeches against the national security in March 1969. Ex-president of the Diretoria Academico '21st of April' university of Goias. S 6/5
 Very reliable information indicates that he was not involved in any violence and has been very badly tortured. Was a medical student at the university. First arrest 1968, then freed. Kidnapped by police in Goiania on 18th November 71. Held now at Policia Especial, Setor Militar, Brasilia.

A Wilson de Carvalho REIS: accused along with 15 others of organising the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Sao Jao de Meriti. Summing up of case took place in 1970; apparently released, but confirmation being sought. 2

A Cleomenes de Paula RIBEIRO: DOPS in Sao Paulo asked for his preventative imprisonment along with 19 others on charges of attempting to re-establish the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in 3 towns of the state of Sao Paulo. Apparently free awaiting trial by the 2nd military court in Sao Paulo. 3

I Oswaldo ROCHA: dentist; arrested September 1973 in Sao Paulo in wave of arrests including many students; according to our information, was allegedly blinded and lost both legs as a result of torture. M 3

I Nelson RODRIGUES F^o: 26 years old; engineer; formerly an employee of the secretariat of Public Works in the state of Guanabara. Suffers from heart trouble. Arrested in Rio and accused of subversive activities. Denied this charge at his trial. Apparently involved in several suits. Mis. 2

I Saul Brasil Pinto RODRIGUES: university professor of sociology at Catholic University of Rio; arrested in September 1970 apparently accused of having committed a 'political offence'. Rumours that he has been released are being investigated by the group. T Mis 2

A Vicente de Paula RODRIGUES: accused with 15 others of re-organising the extinct Brazilian Communist Party in Sao Joao de Meriti. 2

A Luis Basilio ROSSI: arrested 15th February 1973 at his home in Sao Paulo. Even as late as May, three months after his arrest, he had apparently not been allowed to see his lawyer. He was also allegedly subjected to torture and some suggestion that this was brought to an end by rapid Amnesty intervention. Professor of economics at university of Penapolis in Sao Paulo. T Ms 3

- A Fuad SAAD: doctor; accused of subversive activities and of falsification of PCB documents, along with Stanislaw Alkimir Magalhaes. Proceedings began in Rio in February 73. M 2

- A Arlino Moreira SILES: 28 years old; researcher at the university of Campinas (SP); no charge known as yet; whereabouts unknown; motive for arrest thought to be acquaintanceship with Rossi (Amnesty case). Arrested end of February 1973. Mis 3

- I Milton SANTANA: priest from Campinas near Sao Paulo. Accused of practising psychological warfare at school and trying to incite other teachers to communism. Evidently free awaiting trial. C 3

- + I Solange Maria SANTANA: sociologist held in Rio; arrested in 1970 accused of terrorism. She has organised intellectuals to campaign against torture and for the cause of democratic liberties. Allegedly badly tortured. Conflicting reports as to whether or not she has been tried yet even. Held Ilha das Flores. Mis 2
Lawyer: Unknown Germany 458
- A Tilden Jose SANTIAGO: worker priest from Sao Paulo who was arrested in March 1973. Motive thought to be his acquaintanceship with professor Luis Basilio Rossi (also AI case). C 3
Free awaiting trial in Belo Horizonte (MG).
Lawyer: Unknown Sweden 183

- A Aloysio SANTOS F^o: journalist; alleged involvement with PCB and with having sent abroad information on the torture of political prisoners. Was allegedly subject to coercion during interrogation phase of proceedings. Held with his wife, Maria Laura Bastos dos Santos on Ilha das Flores. J 2
Lawyer: Modesto Silveira Sweden 195

- I Antonio Vieira dos SANTOS: employee of Operacao Esperanca - social action group in diocese of Olinda and Recife and therefore probably associated with dom Helder Camara, the archbishop of the diocese. Arrested 24th July 1973 but his arrest has not yet been officially acknowledged. Although it is thought likely that his arrest is most probably linked with his associations with dom Helder, he is accused of training guerrillas. C 7

I Carlos Alberto Nascimento SANTOS: ex-president of the Academic Directorate of the School of Medicine and Surgery of Rio de Janeiro. Arrested 10 minutes after his wedding. Accused of participating in the Volta Redonda religious-layman group led by bishop Waldir Calbeiros. The group was accused of 'subversive activities'. C M 2

A Joel Rufino dos SANTOS: journalist, historian, professor of secondary education; disappeared on 30th December 1972 when he boarded a bus in Sao Paulo to go to Rio. J A S 2
 Lawyer: Modesto Silveira (?) Germany 156 USA 7

A Manuel Verissimo dos SANTOS: Teacher in state of Sao Paulo. Married with a young daughter, who had to be taken to hospital because of the upset caused by her father's arrest. Motive for arrest thought to be acquaintanceship with professor Rossi (AI case) Arrested some time after 15th February 1973. T 3
 Lawyer: Unknown Sweden 20 USA 15

+ A Maria Laura Bastos SANTOS: involved in proceedings with her journalist husband, Aloysio Santos Filho, in Rio, accused of involvement in PCB and of having sent abroad material on the torture of political prisoners.
