Aleitamento Materno e Função Sexual em Primíparas Durante o Puerpério Remoto

O estudo teve como objetivo comparar a função sexual feminina entre os diferentes tipos de aleitamento materno durante o puerpério remoto. A amostra foi composta por 242 mulheres primíparas que estavam vivenciando o primeiro ano do puerpério e foram organizadas em 3 grupos: não amamenta (n=65), aleitamento materno exclusivo (n=65) e aleitamento materno parcial (n=112). Foi questionado se as mulheres estavam ou não amamentando e o tipo de aleitamento materno, para avaliação da função sexual (FS) foi aplicada a versão brasileira do Female Sexual Function Index (FSFI). Nossos resultados indicam que mulheres que amamentam, independentemente do método de aleitamento, possuem redução significativa no domínio desejo.

Introdução

A função sexual (FS) desempenha papel importante na qualidade de vida do ser humano e se dá por interações complexas e dinâmicas que envolvem aspectos físicos, emocionais e psicossociais (Murtagh 2010; Saleh, Hosam & Mphamed, 2019). A disfunção sexual feminina (DSF) é caracterizada por desordem nestes aspectos que levam a diminuição do desejo, excitação, distúrbios orgâsticos e dor gênito-pélvica, na qual ocorrem alterações no ciclo de resposta sexual que impedem a satisfação sexual (Saleh, Hosam & Mohamed 2019).

A prevalência da DSF em idade reprodutiva é de 41% na população mundial (McCool et al. 2016). Em uma revisão sistemática realizada por Wolpe et al. (2017), identificaram uma prevalência que varia entre 13,33% a 79,3% na população brasileira e no puerpério cerca de 40 a 80% das mães relatam DSF. Disfunção esta originada devido as alterações físicas, hormonais, psicológicas, sociais e culturais que ocorrem neste período (Johnson, 2011; Güleroglu & Beser, 2014; Saleh, Hosam & Mohamed, 2019).

Caracteriza-se puerpério como o período do ciclo gravídico-puerperal em que as mudanças ocorridas durante a gestação e parto retornam ao seu estado prégravídico (BRASIL, 2001; MORAES, 2006). Segundo o Ministério da Saúde (2001) seu início se dá entre uma a duas horas após a dequitação da placenta, classificando-se como: imediato (1º ao 10º dia pós-parto), tardio (11º ao 42º dia pós-parto) e remoto (a partir do 43º dia). O Ministério da Saúde (2001) ainda afirma que não há data pré-definida

para seu fim, já que enquanto a mulher amamentar ela estará sofrendo alterações da lactação.

Dentre as alterações supracitadas, a amamentação pode impactar diretamente na FS durante o pós-parto. No entanto esta relação ainda é controversa, visto que alguns estudos apontam que o aleitamento pode impactar negativamente (Lagaert, Weyers, Kerrebroeck & Elaut, 2017; Matthies et al. 2018; Torres et al. 2019) enquanto outros demonstram que a lactação exerce efeito benéfico na FS (Heidari, 2009; Anbaran et al. 2015; Eacava- Dorne, 2015).

Sabe-se que a atividade sexual durante o puerpério é importante, devido a influência da FS em diversos aspectos relevantes da vida humana (Yilmaz, Taplak & Polat, 2019). Contudo, o sistema de saúde demonstra fragilidade no âmbito da saúde sexual feminina, pois, ainda que as políticas de saúde materno-infantis sejam voltadas para a promoção de saúde da diáde mãe-filho, as preocupações da puérpera e dos profissionais são voltadas principalmente para o recém-nascido (RN) (Brasil, 2004; Pereira & Gradim, 2014). Deste modo, considerando o impacto e a repercussão na saúde da mulher e no contexto sociocultural do pós-parto (Ramezani, Ahmadi, Ghaemmaghami, Marzabadi & Pardakthi, 2015), o preenchimento de lacunas pré-existentes e novas estratégias em saúde devem ser traçadas para que as mulheres recebam atenção multiprofissional adequada e possam lidar satisfatoriamente com as adversidades que podem surgir nesse período. Sendo assim, o objetivo do presente estudo foi comparar a FSF entre os diferentes tipos de aleitamento materno durante o puerpério remoto.

Metodologia

Caracterização do Estudo

Trata-se de um estudo observacional do tipo transversal e quantitativo, em que 359 voluntárias foram avaliadas. Esse estudo foi aprovado pelo Comitê de Ética em Seres Humanos da Universidade Federal de Santa Catarina (UFSC) (CAAE: 13189919.0.0000.0121).

População

A população do estudo foi composta por mulheres primípara que estavam no puerpério remoto, residentes em municípios de duas microrregiões do sul catarinense AMESC (Associação dos Municípios do Extremo Sul Catarinense) eAMREC (Associação dos Municípios da Região Carbonífera).

Critérios de inclusão de exclusão

Para as mulheres participarem do estudo precisavam falar e compreender adequadamente o idioma português brasileiro, teridade igual ou superior a 18 anos, estar ativa sexualmente nas últimas 4 semanas, estar vivênciando o puerpério remoto do primeiro filho no período igual ou inferior à 12 meses.

Excluiu-se as voluntárias que atenderam a um ou mais critérios de exclusão: puérperas primíparas com histórico de aborto em idade gestacional superior às 12 semanas, histórico de cirurgia uroginecológica nos últimos 3 anos, que apresentem sinais e sintomas sugestivos de infecção urinária (disúria; hematúria; poliúria) auto relatado nas últimas 4 semanas, mulheres cujo filho tenha sofrido com algum tipo de internação ou problema de saúde nas últimas 4 semanas, mulheres grávidas e, também, gestação multipla.

Procedimento de coleta de dados:

A coleta de dados foi realizada entre março de 2020 à outubro de 2020. As voluntárias foram recrutadas de forma não probabilística por conveniência a partir da divulgação da pesquisa, por meio de mídias sociais (WhatsApp, Instagram e Facebook), com acesso ao questionário online, através do link: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/1s0COH9pY-jN3zF5Dfr7LMjmSG_e8fYl-nGalw96wTyI/edit

Instrumentos de pesquisa

Caracterização da amostra

Para caracterização da amostra foram coletadas as seguintes informações: 1) perfil sociodemográfico: idade; escolaridade (ensino fundamental; ensino médio; ensino superior) renda familiar (1 salário mínimo; entre 2 à 3 salários mínimos; renda igual ou superior à 4 salários mínimos); 2) Amamentação: se a participante está amamentando (sim; não) e qual o tipo de aleitamento materno (Aleitamento Materno Exclusivo; Aleitamento Materno parcial). 3) Referente as medidas antropométricas como peso (em kilogramas) e altura (em centímetros) foram autorrelatadas pelas participantes.

Female Sexual Function Index (FSFI)

Para avaliação da função sexual feminina o questionário Female Sexual Function Index (FSFI), desenvolvido por Rosen et al. (2000) e validada por Meston (2002) e Wiegel, Meston e Rosen (2005). Para aplicabilidade na população brasileira,

o instrumento foi traduzido e validado por Thiel et al (2008) e também por Pacagnella, Martinez e Vieira (2009).

O questionário contém 19 questões, que informam sobre 6 domínios da resposta sexual: (a) desejo, (b) excitação, (c) lubrificação, (d) orgasmo, (e) satisfação e (f) dor (Rosenet al. 2000; Thiel et al. 2008). Sua pontuação se dá de forma crescente entre zero e cinco, exceto pelas questões sobre dor em que a pontuação se dá de forma invertida entre um e cinco (Pacagnella, Martinez & Vieira, 2009). O escore final da escala varia entre 2 e 36 pontos obtidos pela soma dos sub-escores de cada domínio (Rosen et al. 2000)

Além da nota de corte geral do FSFI, o questionário permite que cada domínio seja avaliado e categorizado de forma individual. Jamali, Rahamanian & Javacpour (2016) descrevem que valores inferiores à (4,8) para desejo, (5,0) para excitação, (5,4) para lubrificação, (5,0) para orgasmo, (5,0) para satisfação e (5,5) para dor caracterizam disfunção sexual para os respectivos domínios. Enquanto valores inferiores a 26,5 do escore total constituem o ponto de corte para identificar mulheres com disfunção sexual (Wiegel, Meston & Rosen, 2005).

Análise estatística

Para a análise das variáveis utilizou-se o software estatístico SPSS – Statistical Package for Social Sciences (versão 22.0 IBM®). Inicialmente os dados foram analisados de forma descritiva, através de frequência simples e porcentagem (variáveis categóricas) e medidas de posição e dispersão (variáveis numéricas). As comparações da função sexual entre os diferentes tipos de aleitamento materno foram realizadas através do teste estatístico de Kruskal-Wallis, seguido por comparações par a par pelo teste de U de *Mann-Whittney*, com correção de Bonferroni conforme o número de combinações ($p=0,016$).

Resultados

Inicialmente, foram avaliadas 359 participantes, entretanto, 117 foram excluídas do estudo e 242 mulheres foram elegíveis para a pesquisa conforme demonstrado na figura 1.

A mediana de idade entre as mulheres foi de 27,00 (7,00) anos, 26,8% não amamentavam, 26,8% praticavam o aleitamento materno exclusivo e 46,2% amamentavam de forma parcial seus bebês. Além disso, 52% da amostra apresentou DSF sendo os domínios mais acometidos o desejo (88%), a excitação (74,8%) e a dor (63,2%), seguidos pelo orgasmo (62%), satisfação (59%) e lubrificação (58,7%).

Referente a pontuação na FSFI, verificou-se que houve diferença significativa entre os grupos para o domínio desejo [$H(2): 11,025; p=0,004$]. Foram aplicados testes de U *Mann-Whitney* para comparação par a par dos achados. Nesse sentido, foi aplicada a correção de Bonferroni para identificação de uma novo p valor e todos os efeitos foram testados no nível de $p=0,016$. O desejo foi menor para o grupo de aleitamento materno exclusivo (AME) em relação ao grupo que não amamenta ($U:1459,500, p<0,01$, medida de efeito(r)= $0,19$) e o grupo aleitamento materno parcial (AMP) também apresentou menor pontuação no desejo quando comparado ao grupo que não amamenta ($U:2749,500; p<0,01$ e $r=0,17$). Além deste achado, vale ressaltar que os escores encontrados nos domínios da FS foram abaixo do esperado para ambos os grupos. Os resultados na comparação da FS são apresentados na tabela 2.

Discussão

O objetivo deste estudo foi comparar a FSF entre os diferentes tipos de aleitamento materno durante o puerpério. Os resultados apresentados indicam que as mulheres que não amamentam apresentam melhor desejo em comparação com as mulheres que praticam o AME e o AMP.

Sabe-se que a transição para a maternidade é um período dinâmico da vida, na qual mudanças físicas, hormonais e psicossociais ocorrem (Cárdenas, Kujawa & Humphreya, 2019). Essas alterações causam impacto importante no estado emocional feminino, na vida familiar e na qualidade das relações sexuais (Kalbarczyk et al. 2018).

O desejo sexual feminino depende da interação entre hormônios sexuais, neurotransmissores e fatores biopsicossociais (Clayton, 2010). Nesse sentido, os hormônios esteroidais (estrogênio, progesterona e testosterona) atuantes favorecem a síntese e liberação de dopamina que por sua vez é um neurotransmissor essencial na modulação positiva do desejo sexual, desse modo, as concentrações elevadas de esteroides e de dopamina promovem uma maior probabilidade de que a resposta sexual seja iniciada (Becker, 1990; Clayton, 2003; Sato et al. 2005).

Em contrapartida, a serotonina atua na fase de resolução da resposta sexual, porém quando há neurotransmissão serotoninérgica excessiva ocorre a diminuição do desejo sexual, bem como, quando há aumento das concentrações de prolactina (Halaris, 2003). Além disso, a ação dos opioides endógenos também modulam o desejo sexual humano, logo, sua ação pode reduzir a busca de prazer e, portanto, impactar negativamente neste domínio da função sexual (Pfaus & Gorzalka 1987; Clayton, 2010). Nessa perspectiva o desejo sexual hipoativo, que ocorre durante a

amamentação, pode ser explicado devido o aumento das concentrações e da ação de serotonina, prolactina e opioides influenciando direta e indiretamente na redução da libido feminina (Kamberi, Mical & Porter, 1971; Clemens, Sawyer & Cerimele, 1977; Mena et al. 1976; Dupont, Cusan, Caron, Labrie, & Li, 1977; Cusan et al. 1977; Rivier, Vale, Ling, Brown & Guillemin, 1977; Ferland, Kledzik, Cusan & Labrie, 1978; Van Loon, Ho, Kim, De Souza & Shin, 1979)

Além destes fatores, a redução do interesse sexual pode ser desencadeada pela adaptação à maternidade, que envolve a reorganização dos papéis da mulher diante da sociedade e da expectativa que o papel de mãe seja assumido de forma imediata e sem dificuldades (Salim, Araújo & Gualda, 2010). Assim, as demandas aos cuidados do bebê e a amamentação que se tornam prioridade para as puérperas acabam levando a privação de sono, causando fadiga e estresse (Adanikin, Awoleke, Adeyioli, Aloa & Adaniki, 2015; Barbara et al. 2016; Lagaert, Weyers, Kerrebroeck & Elaut, 2017). Da mesma maneira que fatores físicos como alteração de peso, marcas e cicatrizes na pele podem contribuir para o desenvolvimento da DSF (Song, Chae, Hae & Kim, 2014; Adanikin, Awoleke, Adeyioli, Aloa & Adaniki, 2015; Barbara et al. 2016;). Byrd, Hyde, DeLamater & Plant, (1998) e Polomeno (1999) ainda contribuem sugerindo que a amamentação pode preencher a necessidade de proximidade feminina, antes preenchida pelo parceiro, impactando no interesse sexual.

O puerpério resulta em diferentes situações que gera grande vulnerabilidade para a mulher que vivência este momento (McBride & Kwee, 2017). Pois este período pode resultar em alterações na saúde mental, no bem-estar emocional e na autoimagem corporal, além, da vivência de experiências sexuais passadas com seu parceiro e da qualidade da parceria que são fatores intimamente ligados com o desejo sexual feminino (Clayton, 2010; Dawson, 2020).

Em contrapartida, Nascimento (2006) cita que o estímulo de sucção durante a amamentação ativa os centros neurais sexuais, acarretando sensações prazerosas devido a liberação de ocitocina, o que supostamente melhoraria quadros de anorgasmia. Este efeito pode ser explicado porque durante o orgasmo este hormônio atinge o pico de suas concentrações (Blaicher et al. 1999; Carmichel et al. 1987; Carmichael, Warburton, Dixen & Davidson, 1994). Enquanto Heidari (2009) evidenciou que além da amamentação levar ao retorno da atividade sexual mais cedo, essas mulheres relataram aumento do desejo sexual e do orgasmo. Um estudo realizado por Anbaran et al. (2015) identificaram que o maior escore para FS se deu

em mulheres que amamentavam de forma exclusiva, havendo diferença significativa em relação a lubrificação e satisfação sexual entre os diferentes métodos de alimentação infantil. Escava-Dorne (2015) constatou em sua pesquisa que as mulheres que amamentavam possuíam maior pontuação na FS comparado as que nunca tiveram filhos.

Ainda que as políticas de saúde materno-infantis sejam voltadas para a promoção da saúde do binômio mãe-filho, as preocupações da puérpera e dos profissionais são voltadas principalmente para a avaliação e a vacinação do RN (Brasil, 2004; Pereira & Gradim, 2014). Nesse sentido, a atenção à mulher que se inicia durante a gestação com o pré-natal e se estende até o pós-parto (Brasil, 2005) devem incluir estratégias de saúde que visem o preparo e amparo das mulheres e da sua rede de apoio, por uma equipe multiprofissional, para lidar de forma saudável com as adversidades que podem surgir durante o puerpério. Desse modo, às encorajando a falar sobre as alterações sexuais e se necessário que busquem ajuda de profissionais capacitados. Pois, as evidências demonstram que mulheres submetidas à consultas sobre saúde sexual relatam melhor desempenho na função sexual (Robson, Brant & Kumar, 1981; Von, 1999).

Limitações

O presente estudo apresenta as seguintes limitações: favorecimento a ocorrência do erro tipo 2 devido ao tamanho amostral, além, de tratar-se de um estudo analítico transversal o que impede a correlação entre causa e efeito.

Conclusões

Mulheres que amamentam, seja exclusivamente ou de forma mista, apresentam diminuições no domínio desejo em comparação às mulheres que não amamentam. Dessa forma, a educação em saúde se mostra uma ótima ferramenta para que as puérperas entendam qual as modificações físicas, hormonais e psicossociais que ocorrem neste momento e que influenciam a sua sexualidade. Além disso, o acompanhamento de profissionais de saúde qualificados, como o fisioterapeuta pélvico, possibilita a identificação de disfunções性uais que surgiram durante a gestação ou/e puerpério e ainda se as mesmas já estavam presentes enquanto essas mulheres eram nulíparas. A identificação precoce dessas alterações que impactam diretamente na qualidade de vida permite que estratégias de tratamento sejam traçadas pelos profissionais de saúde, proporcionando que a vida sexual seja vivenciada de forma satisfatória e com qualidade neste período dinâmico na vida da mulher.



Placement and order

The reference section is positioned at the end of the main text under the heading “References.” The section includes entries for all works cited throughout the text. The following rules apply to the arrangement of entries in the section:

5. Reference entries are ordered alphabetically by their first authors' surnames.
6. Reference entries credited to first authors who share surnames are ordered alphabetically by the first authors' given-name initials.
7. References entries credited to the same first authors, with identical surnames and given-name initials, are ordered alphabetically by the subsequent authors' surnames and given-name initials.
8. Reference entries featuring the same full author lists are ordered chronologically by their publication dates (no date/“n.d.” entries, first; then, dated entries; finally, “in press” entries).



	<p>8. Reference entries featuring the same full author lists and the same publication dates are ordered alphabetically by their titles, with introductory articles ("A," "An," "The") ignored. Lowercase alphabetical designators ("a," "b," "c," etc.) are affixed to the publication years of entries in this subset of references.</p> <p>9. Their given-name initials appear before their surnames in entries. Commas separate the name units, and an ampersand ("&") is placed before the final name unit in a list of two to 20 nonauthorial individuals. A role-identifying label, such as "(Ed.)" or "(Eds.)" (for "editor" or "editors") and "(Trans.)" (for "translator" and "translators"), often ends a list of nonauthorial individuals. [Example of editor list], [Example of translator list]</p>
Periodical resources	<p>The title of an article published in a journal, magazine, or newspaper is set in sentence case using roman font in a reference entry. The title of a journal, magazine, or newspaper is, though, italicized and set in title case (headline capitalization). Neither conjunctions and prepositions less than four letters long nor articles ("a," "an," "the") are capitalized in title case unless the words begin the titles.</p> <p>The reference entry for a journal article that has published in its final form (i.e., not as an advance online publication) usually features both a volume number, which is italicized, and an issue number, enclosed in parentheses and set in roman font, after the journal title. The issue number is included even if issues of the journal are continuously paginated within the volume.</p>
Nonperiodical resources	<p>The title of a book, report, dissertation, or thesis in a reference entry is italicized and set in sentence case. The title of a book chapter is set, like a journal article's title, in sentence case using roman font.</p> <p>A reference entry for a book or report includes the name of the publisher under most circumstances but omits the publisher's location. An entry for a dissertation or thesis, similarly, features the name of the awarding institution but excludes the institution's location.</p> <p>If a nonperiodical resource is authored and published by the same organization, the organization is named as the author but not again as the publisher. The publisher name is omitted from the entry; the word "Author" is not inserted as a substitute for the publisher's name. [Example]</p>



Author-supplied translated titles	<p>Under most circumstances, if a reference entry features a non-English title, an author should supply an English-language translation of the title. The translated title, enclosed in square brackets and set in roman font, is inserted after the original title. The capitalization rules of the original language determine the case of the non-English title. Sentence-case formatting, though, is applied to the translated title. In the reference entry for a journal article or a book chapter, an English translation should be provided only for a non-English article or chapter title, not for the journal or book title. For such journals, providing English-language translations for titles throughout the reference section may not be desirable. [Example with retrieval date]</p> <p>DOIs</p> <p>Digital object identifiers (DOIs) are commonly featured in reference entries for journal articles, as well as in entries for other types of electronic resources. Authors do not need to include DOIs for published journal articles when preparing manuscripts. If they are retrievable from registries, the DOIs for published journal articles will be added to entries as links during the production process.</p>
